THE ARC TEACHING HOTEL

The ARC of Indiana announced on December 22nd a ribbon cutting ceremony to open Courtyard Muncie at Horizon Convention Center. The first of its kind teaching hotel developed by ARC Innovations, a for-profit subsidiary of the ARC of Indiana. That took place on Tuesday, December 22nd at 601 South High Street Muncie, Indiana.

Kim Dodson, executive director of the ARC of Indiana and ARC Innovations, said, "since 1956, The ARC of Indiana has been changing the world for hoosiers with intellectual and other developmental disabilities (I/dd) and their families. We have led the way in accessing public education, closing institutions and fighting for the Americans with Disabilities Act. Now, with the opening of Courtyard

Muncie at Horizon Convention Center on December 22nd, and the Erskine Green Training Institute on January 11th, we start a new chapter. This will significantly change employment opportunities and postsecondary education options for people with disabilities."

Housed within the Courtyard Muncie, is the Erskine Green Training Institute that will provide vocational training for employment in the hospitality, foodservice and health care fields. The positions that they will be training in are tray passing and hospital kitchen positions; environmental which includes housekeeping and patient transport. After receiving training, skills will be applied through internships at the hotel, Thr3e Wise Men restaurant housed at the hotel, and IU Health Ball Memorial Hospital.

People with Disabilities can also own or manage a business in the hotel like a gift shop or any kind of business that would work well for a hotel or they can start a small convenience store in downtown Muncie.

"This project is only possible because so many people have come together to achieve this dream. We are making history today that will forever change the lives of people with disabilities," Dodson said.

This is a first of its kind in the nation. It will not only provide post secondary education opportunities for people with disabilities, it will also provide employment opportunities for people with disabilities and will offer a chance for them to own a business in the hotel.

"As we looked at hotel brands, Courtyard by Marriott was our first choice. Not only does this brand bring so much to the venture, their training program is exceptional and their participation in our training institute will be tremendous. Together with all of our key partners, we have built this truly unique training institute and teaching hotel." Dodson said. The Erskine Green Training Institute is a project of the ARC of Indiana Foundation. The Courtyard Muncie at Horizon Convention Center is owned by ARC Innovations.

AIRLINES WORKING WITH DISABILTIES,

The Federal airline regulators are now taking steps to improve service for passengers with disabilities.

U.S Department of Transportation said it was looking for ways to ensure that fliers with disabilities have better in-flight entertainment and to use bathrooms on single-aisle airplanes.

The department, in a Dec.7<sup>th</sup> posting in the Federal Register about service for people with disabilities, noted "the industry trend toward greater use of single-aisle aircraft that are not equipped with accessible bathrooms on mid-length and longer flights."

"The disability community has expressed distress that single-aisle aircraft's are increasingly used by airlines for longer flights but lack accessible lavatories," the department said in the register.

Now disability advocates are working with the U.S Department of Transportation to ensure that fliers with disabilities have the best in-fight entertainment and that the lavatories are accessible.

The Transportation Department said it is considering "a negotiated rulemaking" concerning bathrooms and other accommodations.

Specifically, the negotiated rulemaking, among other things, could explore things like improving accessibility of bathrooms on new single-aisle aircraft. Ensure that passengers with disabilities have access to the same in-flight entertainment as other fliers, and also Develop a consistent definition for service animals.

The Transportation department has hired Richard Parker from the University of Connecticut's law school to determine if they need to set up an advisory committee. The department could decide to set it up or initially proceed with rulemaking on its own.

The airplane manufacture Boeing said they would be glad to participate in the analysis and rulemaking by the Federal Department. The Association of Flight Attendants-CWA has also said they would like to participate in the meetings.

One of the airlines has been find \$2 million over accessibility complaints that were made on the airline back in 2014.
